A SHG is an informal association to enhance the member's financial security as primary focus and other common interest of members such as area development, awareness, motivation, leadership, training and associating in other social inter-mediation programmes for the benefit of the entire community.

Self-help groups are informal groups of people who come together to address their common problems. While self-help might imply a focus on the individual, one important characteristic of self-help groups is the idea of mutual support – people helping each other. Self-help groups can serve many different purposes depending on the situation and the need. For example, within the development sector, self-help groups have been used as an effective strategy for poverty improvement, human development and social empowerment and income-generating activities.

Self-help group (commonly SHG) is a financial intermediary group usually composed of 12 to 25 local women between the ages of 18 and 50. Most self-help groups are in India, though they can be found in other countries, especially in South Asia and Southeast Asia. A SHG is generally a group of people who work on daily earnings who form a loose grouping or union. Money is collected from those who are able to donate and given to members in need. Members may also make small regular savings contributions over a few months until there is enough money in the group to begin lending. Funds may then be loaned back to the members or to others in the village for any purpose.

In India, RBI regulations mandate that banks offer financial services, including insurance free loans to these groups, on very low interest rates. This allows poor women to circumvent the challenges of exclusion from institutional financial services. This system is closely related to that of unity lending, widely used by microfinance institutions. Beyond their function as savings and credit groups, SHGs offer poor women a platform for building solidarity. They allow women to come together and act on issues related to their own lives including health, nutrition, governance and gender justices.

2. Goal / Objective of SHG:

- To provide micro-finance to groups is normally the primary objective of a Self-Help Group (SHG). These groups aim to facilitate the process of self-empowerment. A self-help group (SHG) is a financial intermediary committee usually composed of 10 to 20 local women or men.
- Saving on a regular basis, after a year or two, the group also becomes eligible for availing loan from the bank. The loan is sanctioned in the name of the group and is meant to create self-employment opportunities for the members.
- The SHG's not only collect and save money regularly but also provide the members of the group, an opportunity to discuss regarding the amount of loan and the interest rate to be charged. It, therefore, provides a platform to seek financial independence to the rural poor and women.
- The SHG's help borrowers overcome the problem of lack of collateral while getting loans.

- Self-help groups are started by non-governmental organizations that generally have broad anti-poverty programs. Self-help groups are seen as tools for goals including empowering women, developing leadership abilities among the poor and the needy, increasing school enrolment and improving nutrition and the use of birth control. Financial intermediation is generally seen more as an entry point to these other goals, rather than as a primary objective.

3. The Context:

Self Help Groups (SHGs) are small groups of poor people. The members of an SHG face similar problems. They help each other, to solve their problems. SHGs promote small savings among their members. The savings are kept with the bank. Self Help Groups (SHGs) are small groups of poor people. The members of an SHG face similar problems. They help each other, to solve their problems. SHGs promote small savings among their members. The savings are kept with the bank. From one family, only one person can become a member of an SHG.

The group normally consists of either only men or of only women. Mixed groups are generally not preferred. Women's groups are generally found to perform better. Self-help Groups (SHGs) are informal associations of people who come together to find ways to improve their living conditions. They are generally self-governed and peer-controlled. Every Self-help group usually goes through 3 stages of evolution stated below:

1. Formation of group
2. Funding or Formation of Capital
3. Development of required skills to boost income generation for the group

Many self-help groups are formed with the assistance of Self- help to promote agencies. The various types of Self-help promoting agencies are stated below:

1. Non-governmental agencies
2. Government
3. Poverty management programmes
4. State & commercial banks
5. Microfinance institutions
6. SHG Federations
7. SHG leaders/Entrepreneurs.



4. Importance of SHGs:

- An economically poor individual gains strength as part of a group.
- Besides, financing through SHGs transaction costs for both lenders and borrowers. Where successful, SHGs have significantly empowered poor people, especially women, in rural areas.
- The SHGs have helped immensely in reducing the influence of informal leaders in rural areas.
- Many big corporate houses are also promoting SHGs at many places in India.
- The SHGs help borrowers overcome the problem of lack of collateral. Women can discuss their problem and find solutions for it.
- A SHG is to enhance the member's financial security as primary focus and other common interest of members such as area development, awareness, motivation, leadership, training and associating in other social inter-mediation programmes for the benefit of the entire community.
- SHGs play a vital role in giving credit access to the poor and this is extremely crucial in poverty alleviation. They also play a great role in empowering women because SHGs help women from economically weaker sections build social capital.
- Self-help groups help in women's empowerment by making them independent financially and intellectually.
- It has a serious role to play in combating social evils like gambling, alcoholism, white plague, and more. It instils better habits within the members and leads them to be responsible and become better individuals.
- It helps in elevating the utilization opportunities in rural India and for the agricultural and concrete amongst poor people. It supports micro-level entrepreneurship which reduces the dependence on one source of income and widens income horizons for the members.
- On being a member of SHGs, quick access is provided to government policies and schemes. The schemes are meant for the marginalized and backward section of the society from which most of the members belong.
- It helps in improving the quality of living by providing employment opportunities through micro-finance entrepreneurship. It improves the living standard, Health Care, birth control and literacy rates of the weaker sections of the society.



- It helps within the financial discipline because the members are encouraged to open savings bank accounts which a brief marginalized Savings and improvement in living conditions by spending on education, health, and more
- It increases the active participation within the democracy of the members and all other aspects of the government The weekend marginalized section of the society would be included within the government which might pave way for better roles and policies for his or her development and betterment
- They help women to become financially self-reliant.
- To increase income generating activities.
- To promote saving and raises status in society.

5. **Limitations:**

- Ignorance of Members/Participants

- Availability of funds is limited since funds are pooled by limited members
- Limited working hours and seasons for the operations of the facilities,

- They can also avail loans from banks if their savings are regular.

- Increasing general awareness on literacy among members.
- Equipping the poor with basic skills for understanding monetary transactions.
- Maintaining books and registers to ensure proper accounts.
- provide a financial resource for the poor through organizing the rural poor especially women, into small Self-Help Groups.

9. Evidences of SHGs:

Women's groups are important rural social and financial institutions. In India, a large majority of women's groups programs are implemented through self-help groups (SHGs). Originally designed as savings and credit groups, the role of SHGs has expanded to include creating health and nutrition awareness, improving governance, and addressing social issues related to gender- and caste-based discrimination. The Indian women from five states to study the impact of SHG membership on women's empowerment in agriculture, using the project-level Women's Empowerment in Agriculture and financial. This improvement in aggregate empowerment is driven by improvements in women's scores, not a deterioration in men. Greater control over income, greater decision making over credit, and (somewhat mechanistically, given the treatment) greater and more active involvement in groups within the community lead to improvements in women's scores. The insignificant impacts on attitudes towards domestic violence and respect within the household suggest that women's groups alone may be insufficient to change deep-seated gender norms that disempower women.

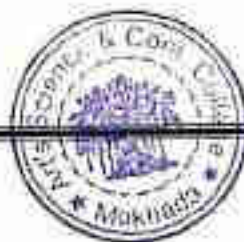

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INTRODUCTION

Ethnobotany is a scientific discipline that comprises the study of human interaction with plants. It mainly focuses on the study of a region's plants along with the practical knowledge of those plants with the help of the traditional knowledge of local people and their culture. It is a branch of botany which dates to ancient times.

Plant resources have always served the primary needs of humans (including healthcare) since time immemorial. Indigenous knowledge of plants is recognised worldwide owing to their intrinsic value, as well as in the field of modern drug development.

Mokhada taluka is located in the womb of Western Ghats. It having most of the Tribal communities like Varli, Thakar, Kolma, Katkari etc. which having deep medicinal knowledge of many wild plants. This knowledge is still hidden from the world. To create awareness about this to the world we have selected this topic.

Suryamal is one of the small villages of Mokhada taluka which having an ancient knowledge of tribal Thakar community which provide a drug from the unknown plant samples which is helpful in the healing of fractured bones. To survey of this area and getting knowledge from this tribal community is helpful for society to create awareness about this tribal medicine.

OBJECTIVES

- To create awareness about tribal medicines
- To survey medicinal plants of Suryamal and surrounding area
- To uplift tribals lifestyle by spreading knowledge of the medicinal wealth to the mainstream society
- To make peoples aware about surrounding medicinal plants

Ethnobotanical study and Medicinal plants survey of Suryamal area

Suryamal is located 19.7557°N , 73.3469°E near Khodala in Mokhada tehsil. It is one of the tribal villages of Mokhada tehsil having Thakar, Kokna, Varli tribes. Among this tribes Thakar tribe prepares an ancient herbal medicine from the unknown plant samples which is useful on the Fractured bone healing.

The medicine was prepared by the old traditional method by collecting the unknown plants and stored them in a bucket of bamboo. This medicine then mixed with water and cow urine and stored again. Then this were dried and packed into leaves of *Butea monosperma*.

The decoction of this medicine was taken by soaking it in water for overnight and the filter through cloth and remaining water sample is consumed in morning before meal. It is most useful for the fractured bone healing.

Along this we were visited the surrounding area which is having diverse flora and fauna. Many medicinal plants were observed in this area, which were conserved by the forest department.

Plants like *Holarrhena pubescens*, *Curcuma pseudomontana*, *Aegel marmelos*, *Moringa oleifera*, *Trichodesma indicum* are observed.

In India,60% peoples are from rural India, and 50% peoples are illiterate. Also 70% of Indian Economy is

Most of illiterate person have no idea about the use of online or cashless system and young peoples have face the problem of internet connectivity and online frauds. Hence awareness about the cashless or online transaction is needed to this people.

Status of Cashless Transactions in Tribal Area:

A cashless transaction is one that uses cards or digital means to complete all transactions. Physical monetary circulation is minimal. India is using excessive money for operations. There is also a significantly greater amount of currency notes in circulation than in other big economies. Recent trends have altered in this context, while the IT revolution in India has changed.

Moreover, central banks would be able to impose any desired monetary policy – including negative rates – as consumers would have no way to retrieve their cash from the banking system.

A demise of paper money would enable governments to exercise a full control over the banking system, including tracking and recording all transactions. If this might be useful in the fight against criminality, it will also impinge on consumer rights to privacy. Furthermore, no one would be immune in case of a system failure, and a stolen or broken Smartphone would immediately leave the victim without a payment tool. Last but not least, the millions of unbanked would be left behind without any resource. According to specialists, a shift to cashless might even create

a second-class citizenry and thus deepen the gap between rich and poor. Topics like Debit credit cards. Net Banking. PIN numbers and OTP. How to do online transactions using Net Banking. Use of Buddy App. Creating Online bank account etc., were taught.

Class and 2 faculty members of Commerce Department of Arts Science & Commerce College, Mokhada are visited to peoples in Warghadpada villages & gives the information to villagers about cashless transaction. After the awareness Peoples of Warghadpada use the various cashless transaction apps smoothly i.e., BHIM, Google Pay, Phone Pay and various mobile bank apps. The also take care about fraud in cashless transaction. Peoples of Warghadpada have received benefits from this awareness programmes.

Challenges of Cashless Transactions in Tribal Area Warghadpada:

Recently promotion of cashless transactions in a mid of demonetization drives with a motive of bring in transparency, curbing black money and illicit transaction is quite challenging for rural areas because of the following challenges:

- Lack of accessibility because of limited internet penetration and inadequate Information and communication infrastructure i.e. Point of sale, ATM, Cards etc.
- In rural regions, digital literacy and the dearer internet and equipment are significant hurdles because weaker financial circumstances make them expensive.
- Rural economy's informal nature gives individuals a feeling of safety in money transactions.
- Lack of exposure, economic analphabetism and analphabetism limit them to trust virtual transactions due to payment insecurity and cyber loot that is widespread,
- Cultural barriers such as language, orthodox and primitive features of society restrict them to embrace economic transactions of modern means.
- Banking infrastructure in the form of banking correspondents is limited to tiny cities rather than fields hampering economic integration in Panchayat. These Challenges can be Overcome

- Connectivity and better accessibility of POS through sound ICT infrastructure under Bharat network should be assured throughout the clock.
- Promoting panchayat-level digital and economic literacy among rural individuals through NGOs, forming trained residents ' local committees, and a dedicated TV channel on the problem.
- By offering multi-lingual internet payment platforms, i.e. mobile apps, you can remove cultural obstacles.
- Last mile delivery of financial services should be ensured through payment banks and Banking correspondents.

The need for rural fields is to simplify the whole process. A lot of complicated process will take away tribal people's interest.

Findings:

Tribal peoples of Warghapada have use of cashless transaction. The cashless transaction's most significant input is that the risk associated with carrying money is anticipated to be reduced. Thus, transactions can be electronically resolved and there is less need to move around with money, so theft and robbery can be decreased. By adopting the cashless economy policy, the growth of financial stability can be enhanced in the country. Cashless transactions also control the corruption in the country and helps in success of digital India initiatives by the Government.

Recommendations:

There is a need to reinforce the awareness campaign about the cashless transaction for both current and potential clients so that everyone can learn about it before using it.

- Internet services should be provided in tribal area.
- The cashless banking policy must provide the system's beneficiary with affordable service fees.

Conclusion:

A cashless transaction is a transaction where all economic transactions take place through digital means rather than through physical currencies. The nation moves towards the cashless economy after demonetization. The government has developed unique discounts and freebies on electronic transactions to promote the step towards cashless transactions. From the study, it is observed that there is not too much awareness of cashless transactions in tribal peoples and that a significant proportion of people are actually waiting for the cashless transaction to be introduced. The outcome indicated that the cashless economy has a beneficial effect on preventing money laundering and stimulating economic growth, but the research area's people are not conscious of the cashless transaction due to many of the problems mentioned above and also debated how to remove these difficulties.

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INTRODUCTION

Water is a natural valuable resource. It is renewable resource as it can be easily replenished through the nature. This natural resource is used for drinking, washing, bathing, agriculture, industries as well as for generating electricity. But due to urbanization, industrialization we require the water. The most of water get available by the way of rain fall in the nature. India is the agriculture dependent country. Our economy is mostly depending on the agriculture. To fulfil the requirement of water we use stored rain water from dams, even river water, excavating well in the farm or taking borewells in the farm. Even nowadays taking borewells for domestic and commercial purpose is the most practiced concept.

The most of people has been taking borewells in an around to their surroundings and drawing the water from the ground to fulfil their needs. While, on the other hand percentage of natural seeping of rainwater in the ground is very less. The research in this field shows that only 5-10 percentage of rainwater infiltrates into ground in the hard rock regions. Even when rainfall percentage is got reduced that again the seeping percentage consequently shows reduction. To solve the availability of water problem, borewell recharge has too much importance. The borewell is very simple method for making available the water for our needs. Through this method we store the rainwater around the surface of borewell and use it whenever necessary.

OBJECTIVES

- To make water available to the future use
- To Make sustainable use of natural resource
- To avoid rainwater run-off
- To improve water level from different strata of the earth

“Borewell Recharge in College Campus”

Mokhada is located 19.9365° N, 73.3404° E hilly area and comes in the Konkan region where rainfall is high. But most of the rainwater is drain out from the top of hills in the valleys. So, most of water drain out and very less amount of water is percolated in the strata of land. Even peoples are facing water scarcity in the season of summer.

Arts, Science and Commerce College, Mokhada has been undertaken the borewell project to fulfil the need of our college. Recharging borewell mostly concern with use of water obtained from rainfall or nearby water bodies. In other word, we can also say that it is nothing but rainwater harvesting.

Borewell recharging technically focuses on the use of harvested surface water (obtained via rainfall or nearby water bodies) where run-off water begins to pass through a natural filter made up of large and small stones. Then, there is another layer of sand through which water passes and finally, it perforates in the borewell pipe via a fine mesh which is wrapped around the drilled casing pipe. The fine mesh ensures the removal of big and tiny impurities before the water enters the borewell.

METHOD

Direct Recharge:

In the direct recharge method, a percolation pit, usually 10×10 feet, is dug around the tube well's casing pipe. This casing pipe is then perforated with a drill machine and the holes are covered by a nylon mesh. The mesh ensures nothing, but the water goes across the borewell. Now the pre-casted RCC (Cement) rings are placed around the borewell casing through which the harvested water would seep to reach the nylon mesh of casing pipe and proliferates into it through its holes. The empty area between the walls of well and rings is then filled with filtering materials like sand, gravel, crushed stone, jelly and such others. The rain water from adjacent water body such as a catchment pond is diverted into this well, it gets filtered and then continue to seep into the casing pipe, thus refilling the bore well.

Direct Borewell recharge is recommended only if the borewell has run dried or is yielding a negligible amount of water. Even a running borewell can practice direct recharging in case of surplus surface water which otherwise would go down the drains and get wasted. Though letting unfiltered surface water to seep into the ground is highly discouraged as this may contaminate the ground water or clog the aquifer with impurities such as toxic minerals like fluoride and industrial chemical waste.

Direct method:

Our college has been used direct recharge method to recharge the borewell. The recharging of borewell is done as below:

1. Initially percolation pit is excavated with the help of JCB of 2 meter long, 2-meter width and 1.5-meter depth dimension around the borewell casing pipe.
2. The open surface of casing pipe is then perforated with the help of drill machine. The pore size of is 4-5 mm diameter considered for that even care is taken there should be taken distance between 2 pore is 1-2 cm.

3. The holes are then covered by nylon mesh with pore size 2mm.
4. Empty area around the casing pipe is filled with stones of size 20 to 24 mm diameter in size, this layer is of 25 cm in thickness.
5. Over this layer crushed stone or khadi of 9.5 to 15.5 mm is put on and this layer is of 25 cm in thickness.
6. Then kaehkadi of 0.6 to 2.00 mm is spread and this layer is of 25 mm in thickness.
7. Lastly broken pieces of bricks put over with thickness of 25 cm.
8. Even some part of pit is levelled with the help of khadi.
9. The rain water flow from adjacent areas is diverted to recharging pit area.

- The borewell water level was increased.
- Strata level was saturated and increased.
- It is particularly well suited for nonpotable purposes, such as landscape irrigation, because health risks are minimal and public acceptance is high.
- Where the recharged water is to be used for potable purposes, the health risks and uncertainties are greater.
